A sad event that starts our school year, however, it also highlights our strengths as a community and so I would extend a very warm welcome to you to Raglan Area School, to all returning students and whanau and particularly to those of you who are new to our community and our Kura, welcome, welcome, welcome.

On behalf of the school I would like to pay our respects and condolences to Joseph Rao and his family on the passing of his mother last week. We know that she will leave a great gap in the hearts of her whanau. We remember her as a gracious host who often opened her home to our students when we were competing as teams in the Tauranga area and where we enjoyed her manaaki and her aroha.

Welcome back to staff who have been on leave, including Matua Larry, and the return of his wife, Whaea Donna, as well as Whaea Sheree, Whaea Ariana, and Whaea Tracy. Welcome also to Matua Jason who is on staff this year working in the Year 3-4 area of the school, and Whaea Megan who will begin shortly in the Year 1-2 area.

Whaea Linda (Years 0-2) Whaea Hillary (Years 3-4) and Whaea Donna (Years 5-6) are the lead teachers through the English Medium primary area of the school. Gwyn Brodie (the Assistant Principal Years 7-10), Mrs Sweetman (the Assistant Principal Years 11-13) and Whaea Liz (the Assistant Principal for Te Ropu Aroha Ki Te Reo) are responsible for teams of teachers under the leadership of Deputy Principals Bronwyn Haitana and Quenten Browne. This year is particularly significant as it is our 150<sup>th</sup> Jubilee year and the Sesquicentennial Jubilee (1866-2016) will be celebrated during Labour Weekend 22<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> October 2016. Our senior students were collectively successful in their studies for 2015 with improvements in our statistics for Level 1 through Level 3 and, very pleasingly, we had a significant number of subject endorsements as well as several Excellence and Merit endorsements. We are delighted with our students' endeavours and successes and thank all those responsible for supporting their learning.

The Board of Trustees consulted with our community, contacting every family whose children attended our school, to gain an insight into their views regarding dress codes and uniforms for our school. The data is shared with you in this mail-out along with redeveloped guidelines and policies. While a formal uniform is not endorsed by the community feedback it is clear that the dress code needed clarification as did the wearing of PE Uniforms and Travel Uniform. These are also included in this mail-out.

(Monday the 1<sup>st</sup> was Auckland Anniversary and Monday the 8<sup>th</sup> is the holiday for Waitangi Day and Easter this year includes Good Friday March 25<sup>th</sup> through to and including Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> March)

Term 2 Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> May - Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> July

Term 3 Monday 25th July - Friday 23rd September

**Term 4 Monday 10<sup>th</sup> October - Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> December** (this allows for one further TOD during the Year yet to be decided)

#### **Board of Trustee Announcement**

Kia Ora Koutou! Welcome to 2016. Late last year the Board of Trustees consulted with our school community to establish whether the community supported a dress code or a school uniform (of some description) for those students enrolled at Raglan Area School. Thank you to all families who took the time to return the consultation and offer feedback/ suggestions.

The Board issued 344 consultation documents to eligible participants. They received a response rate of 28%, with 149 students being represented.

The official results of the consultation are as follows:-

52% of respondents opted for Option 1 (dress code) as their first choice 28% of respondents opted for Option 2 (partial uniform) as their first choice

14% of respondents opted for Option 3 (full regulation uniform) as their first choice

At a meeting held  $26^{th}$  January 2016, the Board of Trustees made an unanimous decision to retain the dress code that currently operates within the school. Factors taken into consideration included the low response rate, and of those that did respond, over half were supportive of a dress code. The approved dress code for Year(s) 0 - 13 have been included with this newsletter. At this same meeting, the Board also approved introduction of a new PE Uniform Top for Years 7-13 while retaining the existing PE shorts. A uniform T-Shirt will be required for all students in Year 0-6.

We are allowing an amnesty until the end of Term 1 so families can budget, plan and transition into the new uniform requirements. Full compliance will be required by the beginning of Term 2. Purchase information and sizing options will be made available in the next newsletter.
