Wonderful to listen to and in the end what the weekend was all about. I hope that all who participated rejuvenated friendships and thoroughly enjoyed the camaraderie. The unveiling and blessing of the waharoa was a joy, the food was outstanding, the guest speaker, (Dick Taylor) was highly entertaining, and the company was great!

I would like to thank the Jubilee Committee for all of their hard work, the carvers for their time and creativity, the 161 Battalion for their support, Waikato-Tainui for their support and marque, the Student Leadership team, and the very many people that gave up their time and energy to make the weekend successful. In particular I would like to thank Rob Turnbull and Helen Le Lievre who were particularly generous in their time and support preparing for the event.

The Minister for Education Ms. Parata announced officially that there is 4 million dollars budgeted for eleven new classrooms in the Waikato and two of these are for Raglan Area School, in response to roll growth. We expect to be in negotiation with the Ministry in the next few weeks to arrange their arrival and location.

Summer is coming, that despite an astonishingly wet last few weeks with waterlogged landscapes across the whole motu. We ask that students during the two summer terms "Play Safe in the Sun", and ask that hats be worn for all outdoor activities. During Term 1 and Term 4 hats are required for Years 0-6 and hat wearing, outside, will be encouraged through Years 7-13. The use of sunscreen by staff and students prior to outdoor activities will be encouraged. SPS 30⁺ Broad Spectrum Sunscreen is supplied. Children (particularly Years 0-6) will be encouraged to eat in designated shady areas. The importance of fluid replacement during outdoor/sporting events will also be promoted.

Hats with the school logo attached are available through the uniform shop and can be purchased on-line or by visiting the store.

Construction companies have started work in the school and areas are being fenced off as I write, movement within these areas have been restricted. The contractors will be working on the halls toilets and changing areas, the hall foyer, K block toilets and the changing shed at the pool. During Christmas they will be replacing the roof on the hall and part of the roof on K block. Tenders have also been let for the upgrade of D Block and the dental clinic and we expect that this work will also begin this term. I will advise start dates and special arrangements as they come to hand.
