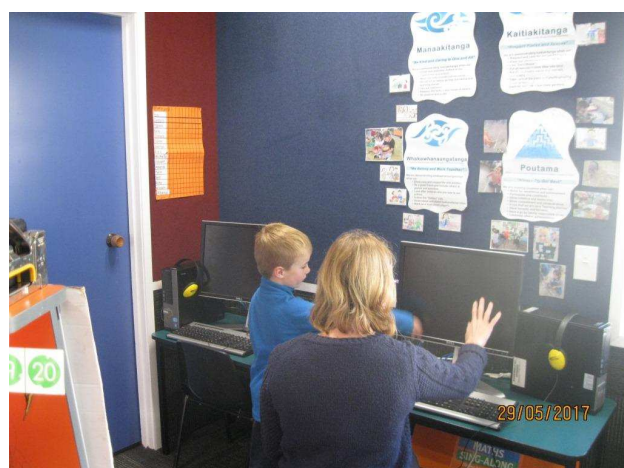
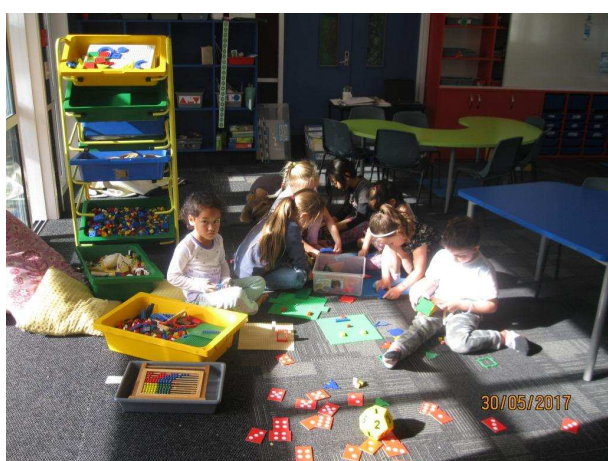
# Squiggle July Holiday Programme
