- Your child will need to check out their online timetable and then connect through their subject area to attend online learning sessions.

- If you have any queries about kura mahi please contact your child's whānau teacher.

- All students will be recorded as present for Monday-Wednesday(August 23-25).
- Each student has at least one online class to attend each day. Students in attendance will be marked as present.
- Non-attendance will be recorded as 'unjustified'. If your child is sick, please contact your kaiako (teacher) this will be recorded accordingly.Please keep us informed as you always do.
