



What drives learning in Kura Teina?

- Structured Literacy Approach-Provides an explicit, systematic and sequential teaching of literacy
- Write that Essay- A writer's toolbox that will greatly improve individuals' writing capabilities and skills.
- Play based learning- tamariki can explore, experiment, discover and solve problems in imaginative and playful ways.
- Differentiated learning-learning that targets individual needs rather than a "one size fits all' approach
- Student Agency-a collaborative way of learning where choices play an active role in learning.
- A dedicated team of Kaiako whose sole purpose is to help our tamariki be the best they can be.

Home Learning: Develop Executive Functioning Skills at Home



You can support your child by encouraging "life skills at home" e.g. getting ready for school by packing their own bag, talk about what's happening the next day - get ready for it! Set routines for the morning and after school. Ask questions, reflect on the day. Have a N O W approach (No opportunities wasted) Create whanau experiences such as walking, visit the rock pools, fish, beach, bike rides and the art gallery.


